

Prospect Revenge Explores the Darker Side of Cryptocurrency



Through his residency at FACT, Liverpool, artist Robertas Narkus has established *Prospect Revenge* - a cryptocurrency with an investment scheme converting rage, disappointment and stress into assets.

As a FACT artist in residence, realised within the framework of the European Media Artists in Residency Exchange (EMARE), artist **Robertas Narkus** has turned his gaze to the world of cryptocurrency. **Prospect Revenge**, a satirical take on our investment obsessed culture, uses familiar, often aggressive corporate behaviours and language. The project documents the launch of an absurd investment scheme, enabling you to make money out of negative emotions.

Employing the darker side of the corporate exchanges which fuel consumerism, Narkus uses meaningless jargon to highlight the surreal nature of business pitches. Through a series of these bizarre pitches, as well as images, videos shared on social media and a promotional website, the artist exposes how entrepreneurs attempt to sell new and often unnecessary business ideas - or, in some cases, attempt to sell nothing at all.

In keeping with his tongue-in-cheek approach to cryptocurrency, Narkus has developed a speculative currency of his own, available in the form of a number of limited edition coins named the *Revenge Coin*. The coin allows you to convert negative emotions such as rage, disappointment and stress into assets for €99.99. A preview of work developed in residency for *Prospect Revenge* was also on display at FACT earlier this year.

Prospect Revenge has also been commissioned by FACT and Culture Liverpool as part of *The Future World of Work.* This 18 month cultural programme allows artists in residency to investigate the impact of technology and rapidly changing working practices on society, culture and wellbeing. Artists involved focus on issues such as the gig economy, immaterial labour, gender representation and automation.
